Did you know?

- Red pandas are the original panda, discovered some 50 years before the giant panda!
- The origin of the name "panda" derives from a Nepalese word for red panda "Nigalya poonya" which means "eater of bamboo".
- Despite sharing the same name, they are not closely related to the giant panda. They are a part of their own family - Ailuridae.
- They are found in the Himalayan forests.
- On average, they weigh slightly more than a house cat.
- They are crepuscular, meaning they are most active in the early morning and late afternoon.
- Red pandas are arboreal which means they live in trees. They will spend their days conserving their energy amongst the trees.

Amazing Adaptations

Did you know Red Pandas have a superpower? They can turn invisible! A Red Panda's colors camoflage them from predators. Learn more below, and color as you go!

RED on their backs is the same color as moss found on the trees where they live

WHITE on their face is almost "luminescent" and can guide a mother's lost cubs in the darkness

A long tail helps balance across tree branches



BLACK on Red Panda's stomachs make them difficult to spot when you look up into trees

Furry paws help help grip onto slippery, mossy branches The fluffy tail also acts as a blanket in winter to keep the Red Panda warm
